

CUMULATIVE INDEX TO *Radio Age*

From October 1975 through December 1993

Radio Age (as published by Donald O. Patterson) began with Volume 1, Number 1, in 1975 and continued until December 1993. (This index does not include the MAARC newsletter of the same period. Nor does it include *Radio Age* published by MAARC that began in June 1994. See a separate index for those publications.)

The index below lists items by author and by subject matter (keywords). Numbers precede letters in the alphabetizing scheme used here. The reference is coded as abbreviated month and year, a colon, and the beginning page number. For example, Jun86: 7 means the referenced information can be found beginning on page 7 of the June 1986 issue of the newsletter. Ad reproductions are listed at the beginning of each manufacturer's listing in addition to having its own major heading. Book reviews are listed by book author under the heading "Book Reviews" as well as under the name of the reviewer. Because of misnumbered issues, it might be best to also describe the article you are seeking to ensure that you receive the correct issue when you order a back issue.

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We have tried to make this index error-free, but proofreading a document such as this is daunting!
